District Priority 1: Student Learning

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- ✓ Board Chair Rosadiuk acknowledged <u>Bullying Awareness Week</u> in Alberta and the work of GYPSD staff to ensure students have safe, welcoming, caring and respectful learning environments.
- ✓ Director of Curriculum and Assessment,
 Carra Aschenmeier, provided a status
 report on Alberta Education's
 curriculum changes, highlighting the
 contributions of GYPSD teachers to
 engage in this important work. In
 addition, GYPSD teachers mark Diploma
 Exams and PATs and serve on item
 development panels and working groups
 all in the service of improving our
 students' learning!
- ✓ Superintendent Lewis shared the success of the Division's innovative program options and supports for student learning in the Virtual platform, including language and conversation support for French Immersion students, the Christian Learning pilot, and the TLC sites providing one-on-one support and paper-based resources when needed.
- ✓ GYPSD has been given the green light to become an official Home Education provider in 2021-2022.

District Priority 2: Teaching and Leadership Excellence

- ✓ The Board of Trustees approved:
- the <u>Division's 3 Year Education Plan (3YEP) and Alberta Education Results Report (AERR) document</u> for submission to the government for November 30, 2020, applauding GYPSD's many successes including excellent financial standings, and outlines innovative, research-based strategies the Division will employ to further improve student learning outcomes.
- the Division's Financial Audited Statements for 2019-2020. The Board received praise from the independent auditor for "an extremely well-done process and report".
- ✓ Managing Director of Facilities, Ken Baluch, reported on GYPSD buildings – ensuring they are well maintained and provide welcoming environments.
- ✓ Key highlights from the Superintendent's Report include:
 - GYPSD's readiness to respond to the <u>Premier's</u> Announcement on November 24, 2020.
 - Meetings with principals and lead teachers for Indigenous learning, Literacy, Numeracy and Technology for each of the Division's schools.
 - Participation and attendance at many provincial meetings, the Council of School Councils' meeting and Community Coffee Conversations hosted by the Trustees.
 - Addition of Numeracy Consultant to support teachers in math instruction.
 - Teacher Employee Bargaining Association meeting.
