- ✓ The Board received a report from Managing Director of Learning Services Carra Aschenmeier describing the New Teacher Orientation Professional Learning event hosted for 21 teachers new to GYPSD in August: "we are passionately committed to supporting teachers to become reflective, collaborative, successful and effective...to ask questions, learn from and with their colleagues, and thrive."
- ✓ Superintendent Lewis's Report:
 - spoke to the success of this year's first <u>Division Leadership Team</u> (DLT) meeting that took place on August 26th. Principals, Assistant Principals and Central Office leadership enjoyed a rich day of conversation, problem-solving, and leadership focused on student learning
 - provided the exciting news that the Hinton Friendship Centre was successful in their Federal grant application process and would be contributing funds to support the <u>Indigenous Language and Culture</u> <u>Program Partnership with Crescent</u> <u>Valley School</u>, celebrated in June.

✓ Trustees shared feedback from their constituents on mandating masks for staff and students in schools. All GYPSD staff and GYPSD parents will be asked to complete an online survey during the week of September 13th – 17th. The Board will review the data and vote on a Division-wide masking policy at the October 6th Public Board Meeting.

- Approve the Superintendent's contract and request to carry forward unused vacation days
- Approve the use of up to 1.5 million in undesignated reserves to support construction of a second gym for the <u>three-school</u> <u>amalgamation and modernization project in Evansburg</u>
