## District Priority 1: Student Learning

- ✓ Board Chair Rosadiuk reminded everyone that September 30<sup>th</sup> is Orange Shirt Day – the goal of which is to create awareness of the individual, family, and community inter-generational impacts of Residential schools through Orange Shirt Day activities, and to promote that Every Child Matters.
- The Chair shared, "GYPSD staff and students wear orange and participate in various events and activities to support reconciliation. September 30th was also recently acknowledged by the Federal government as the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Supported centrally by the Learning Services Team, our school-based Indigenous Pathways' lead teachers will be sharing a range of resources, activities, and videos with their colleagues to support our Board's commitment to learning, healing, and success for all students."

## District Priority 2: Teaching and Leadership Excellence

- ✓ The Board received a report from Managing Director of Learning Services Ms. Aschenmeier describing the Division's commitment to providing targeted and purposed professional development support and coaching in literacy and numeracy. Literacy and numeracy encompass the knowledge and skills students need to access, understand, analyze and evaluate information including quantitative and spatial information, to make meaning, and participate in activities at school and in their lives beyond school.
- ✓ Highlights from Superintendent Lewis's Report included:

## District Priority 3: Community Engagement

committed to leading advocacy for strong public
education, building collaborative relationships and
developing solution-focused partnerships to ensure
success for GYPSD students and community.

Highlights include:

- ✓ The Chair shared correspondence from the <u>Alberta</u> <u>School Boards Association</u> (ASBA) to all the province's Board Chairs.
- ✓ The exciting work to modernize Grand Trunk High School into a K-12 school began with a Design and Visioning Event. Attendees heard from the Alberta Infrastructure Project Manager and Board Chair Rosadiuk about the parameters and goals for the school. The community is looking for support to build a second gym. A survey for stakeholders to share their ideas is open until October 1st.
- √The Board of Trustees passed a motion to advocate to <u>Premier Kenney</u> and MLAs <u>Long</u> and <u>Getson</u> that the province make September 30th *Orange Shirt Day* and *National Day for Truth and Reconciliation* –a statutory Holiday.
- √The Board of Trustees received a report on Student <u>Transportation Services</u> from Managing Director of Board Relations, Dr. Harding. The Division is always recruiting for bus drivers.
