The Ida Halpern Collection - Celebrating Indigenous Music & Culture

- "Indigenous communities hold the rights [UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples] to the songs recorded by Halpern, and it is the responsibility of the Royal BC Museum to facilitate these rights" Genevieve Weber, author.
- The Ida Halpern fonds is an extensive collection of audiovisual, text, and photographic items documenting the songs, ceremonies and culture of Canada's west coast. The precious archive includes 342 sound recordings, 735 images, and a variety of multimedia items, as well as a 32-minute recording of an interview of Ida Halpern speaking about her work along with a selection of music: **The Ida Halpern Collection**
