- 1. <u>Pick a Time and a Place that Works for You</u> This should be a space that is quiet, comfortable and distraction free.
- 2. <u>Study A Little Bit Every Day</u> This allows you to bring the concepts and ideas up in your mind often and allows you to store the information more effectively.
- 3. <u>Plan Your Study Times</u> Make a schedule that is reasonable and stick to it.
- 4. <u>Discover Your Learning Style</u> If you learn best through listening you can read your notes aloud, talk with others about the subject area or record key points on your personal device and listen to them back. If you learn best through visuals you can color coordinate your notes, draw diagrams, thought webs and timelines to help you remember key concepts. If you learn best by doing you can try such things as role playing or building models.
- 5. <u>Review and Revise</u> Have friends or family quiz you. Make study materials that will work for you and your learning styles.
- 6. <u>Take Breaks</u> It is important that you take brain breaks to refresh yourself. Step away from your study area and move throughout your break to get yourself ready to work again.
- 7. <u>Ask for Help</u> Teachers can help you during your Flex PAT & Flex Diploma courses.
- 8. <u>Stay Motivated</u> Continue to work on your studying and do not get discouraged. Keep to your schedule and don't leave things to the last minute.
- 9. <u>Snack on Brain Food</u> Snacking on nutritious foods and water while studying can aid with your concentration and memory.
- 10. <u>Take Care of Yourself</u> You will perform best on tests and quizzes when you are healthy and well rested. Practicing self-care will also help you to manage during stressful times such as exam week.

Most importantly, remember that you got this! Leave the stressing out to your teachers and just keep swimming... we mean studying!

While our Grade 6,7, and 8 students worked hard on building their own scripts, playing instruments and acting out skits. They were greeted by our leadership team at our school where they played games in the gym, made crafts, watched movies and ate popcorn.
