1. Do you have any concerns about the Evansburg – Wildwood Facilities Review Project? (52 answered and 1 skipped)

- I want my child to be able to complete high school in Evansburg
- Low enrolment, closing schools
- I am very concerned that at the meetings I attended that all the talk was focused on Evansburg. I do not think that Wildwood school should be downsized or closed at all. I think if you take away the school you take away Wildwood. It would have a great impact on our Hamlet. We would lose people coming into Wildwood, our value of land would decrease, our park would suffer and all our businesses would suffer. At the meetings, the main focus of talk was about Evansburg and how the two school there should be modernized or rebuilt. No talk of Wildwood school until parents of Wildwood school started to ask about it. I am very confused on why Evansburg? It's on the very edge of our county and would only service Evansburg, Entwistle (who is not in County) and Wildwood. I think you should look at the bigger picture and more than likely in the near future, that Niton would also be shutting down. I think a new school should be built in Wildwood from K-12 to serve Enwistle, Evansburg, Wildwood and Niton. If we focus on better courses being offered, I even think that some homeschooled children in our area would come to the school as well. I do believe that there is a high number of homeschooled children we need to focus on getting back into our school rather than the 10 children that come to our school right now from Entwistle which is not even any of our County's children. Having the school in Wildwood would cover the whole East side of the County. I also think by combing buildings together is also a great idea. The Wildwood complex has a lot of land and building in that area would benefit the complex and new school. Both can be used together. Just like in Drayton Valley how they added a school onto the Omniplex.
- Information presented is not complete
- Very concerned about the possible closure of Wildwood School.
- I'm concerned that this project will not be taken seriously by the board of education and put on the waiting list for another year. Each facility is in dire need and cannot be neglected.
- My concern is that the betterment of all kids will be overlooked because people are too hung up on "their" school being shut down.
- Fear of losing school in Wildwood
- Yes, I do not think all Wildwood kids should have to be bussed. That is still a lot of kids. We live in Wildwood and I love the school and how close it is. If the school is removed here no one will want to move here and it will be a ghost town!

- How can we increase enrolment? Would like to move students grade 7-9 to Grand Trunk and K -6 to Evansview
- I think we need to have a meeting again in another month, not waiting until September. I think by then your minds will already be made up and Wildwood would suffer.
- I have grandchildren attending and I also worked at Evansview 40 years so I do have a vested interest in the school system
- Closing any of these schools will kill the community
- The three schools need modernization, get it done.
- Schools are the hub of farming communities.
- I really think combining all 3 schools is the best plan. I would prefer to see a completely updated and modernized school that provides an incredible learning experience for all kids than to see just one school get an upgrade.
- Envansburg/Entwistle have 3 schools in an area. Why should we lose ours! :(
- I have 4 kids that attend Wildwood school, the teachers are amazing, the community is one big family, if you take our school away we have nothing, even the local businesses benefit from the school, the kids do the grandparent program and engage with their elders, they get to go outdoor skating at the complex every winter, and they get lots of field trips because we are a small school, please don't close our school, the community needs it to survive, and so do my children...
- I feel: 1) that should Wildwood lose its school there would be a huge impact on the town. I feel the community would fade away. Right now, the school has about 100 students but if the school is closed there is no guarantee that those families will stay around. I feel you will see a continued negative trend of enrolment in the remaining schools. 2) If Evansview and Wildwood are combined there are only a chance that it might draw more families to the area. This move does not increase the number of students attending Grand Trunk. 3) It does not matter the change the percentage of busing will only increase. It's rural Alberta.
- I am the Program Coordinator for Lobstick Successful Kids & Families our office is located in Wildwood School. We also hold a program in Wildwood School, Evansview School, Niton School and Entwistle School.
- If schools are merged I would have to re-evaluate sending my child to the merged school, I would consider sending my child to the nearby Entwistle school where it is smaller
- There seems to be a lot of preschoolers/babies in both communities right now. The playschools had waiting lists this year. Perhaps enrolment will rise. High school needs to offer better courses if they want the kids to stay in town.
- I think get rid of one school not two
- It is time that we look at the benefits for our Jr/Sr high school students. We need to have better options for these students and this can not be done with the current populations in both schools.
- If you close Wildwood School, you ruin the community.
- Looking forward to hearing what the next step will be
- That's it? That's your survey? Very inadequate.
- We believe it's important to proceed expeditiously with combining schools to increase efficiency in our school division.

- I think Wildwood should be a K-6 school and grades 7-12 at Grand Trunk. This way each community isn't really losing a school.
- I hope that Grand Trunk High School becomes a K-12 school or 7-12 school so it is able to receive the best programming possible. Also, then renovations will actually take place.
- Closing the school in Wildwood will kill the community the school needs to be built there Evansburg will survive. Niton is also in bad shape having a school in Wildwood would allow for more Niton students to have access to a building closer to them.
- We have friends with kids who are close to us, nieces and nephews too, it is most important to be included in these decisions.
- We live in Entwistle and send our high school aged children to Stony Plain where there are more options and opportunities available. I do not believe at this time that Grand Trunk provides educational opportunities for every student. With a K-12 School, I believe this could change and we would consider keeping our child in Grande Yellowhead. If not, she will attend high school in Stony Plain.
