- Trustees approved the 2019/2020 school calendar, and approved-in-principle the 2020/2021 and 2021/2022 calendars. Board Chair Brenda Rosadiuk noted that the board was very pleased with the high percentage of survey respondents on this year's pilot calendar, which included a fall break. - The board approved a letter to the Premier of Alberta in support of the repeal of the Tobacco Reduction Amendment in regards to the potential effects the repeal may have on public health, particularly on school-aged youth.

- A letter from the Honourable Minister of Education D. Eggen noted the positive review from the department on the division's current Three-Year Education Plan and Annual Education Results Report.
