District Priority 1: Student Learning

- ✓ On behalf of the Trustees, Board Chair Rosadiuk recognized **Education Week** as an opportunity to point out the important work Division teachers do to ensure student learning remains a top priority despite the challenges of COVID.
- ✓ [GYPSD schools](#) are fact-based information hubs, providing digital devices and technology support, facilitating access to nutritional meals for struggling families, and maintaining student access to mental health supports and counseling.
- ✓ The Education Week theme for the past three years has been *Learning is a Journey*. Chair Rosadiuk shared her tremendous pride in the partnerships that exist between teachers, students, and families in the support of student learning.
- ✓ Superintendent Lewis applauded parents for supporting student learning on the home-front and to teachers for their attention to good assessment practices. - ✓ Superintendent Lewis congratulated the *Principal Selection Committee* for its work this past month and pointed out that the strength of the candidates required two rounds of interviews. In total, there are four [new principal appointments](#) for 2020-21:

- ✓ Superintendent Lewis participated in the Edwin Parr finalist selection committee for Zone 2/3 and praised the incredible talents of first year teachers supporting student learning throughout Northern Alberta.
- ✓ All of GYPSD's second year probationary teachers received continuous contracts. Congratulations to these GYPSD teachers!
- ✓ Despite the challenges of the COVID pandemic, teachers and school leaders are rising to the challenge, and growing in their instructional expertise, working shoulder-to-shoulder to ensure GYPSD students are supported and accounted for. Principals are working through next year's budget projections, ensuring the majority of their budgets are directed to the classroom. #teachingmatters!
