• Board reviewed the Board Annual Work Plan for the upcoming months.

## Superintendent's Report

### Superintendent's Update

- Shared the success of the School Visits in Jasper, Grande Cache and Edson
- Provided Principals with an update on enrollment, staffing, and budget.
- Superintendent Lewis and the Board of Trustees have witnessed student learning with a focus on literacy instruction in core subjects.
- On October 11, 2019, each school will be doing a deep dive analysis into their provincial Accountability Pillar results.
- Superintendent Lewis and Secretary Treasurer Nicholson met with the Deputy Minister of Education to talk about the Division and the role of the Board. Superintendent Lewis shared that GYPSD's Board uses data to drive decision making and is well informed and knowledgeable.
- Met with School Council Chairs during the school visits and was pleased to hear positive feedback regarding the junior kindergarten programs being

offered throughout the Division where many schools have waiting lists.

- Will be attending a meeting on October 10, 2019, where Kevin Cameron will be presenting. There will be representatives from the Alberta Teachers' Association as well as the Deputy Minister.
- Indigenous Palisades Camp took place on October 7 and 8, 2019, at the Palisades Stewardship Education Centre in Jasper. Superintendent Lewis shared that she received correspondence from a government official who was in attendance, thanking the Board and Superintendent Lewis for the invitation and a well-organized event.

## School Enrollments - September 30

 Enrollments for the 2019/20 school year are up 66 students in comparison to the 2018/19 school year. Allocation of funds from the province is given to the principals by a per pupil amount and school administration are expected to create a balanced budget from that allocation and based on the needs of the school.

# 2018 - 2019 International Field Trips and Field Trips

 GYPSD has supported student participation on international field trips and field trips for numerous years. International field trips and regular field trips offer student enhancements to education opportunities, building global citizenship, and developing social awareness skills in youth. Experiential learning builds essential competencies for life and the world of work. Trustees were pleased to see the many opportunities GYPSD students have to visit outside communities through extra-curricular activities, sporting events, and curriculum-based experiential learning opportunities.

# Curriculum, Summer School Program, Dual Credit, Work Experience, Registered Apprenticeship, and First Nation Métis and Inuit Graduation Updates

 C. Aschenmeier, Director of Curriculum, Assessment and Indigenous Liaisons, provided updates to the Board on a number of programs.

#### Curriculum Update

Recommendations from the provincial advisory panel is expected to be publicly shared in December 2019. The Division implemented working and advisory committees in the 2018/19 school year, and continues to provide professional development opportunities to support the implementation of future curriculum.

#### **Summer School Program**

A high number of students took advantage of the wide variety of 2019 summer school programming that was offered by both Parkland Composite High School in Edson and The Learning Connection; for example, more than 140 students registered in the Career and Life Management (CALM) session. Outdoor experiential learning opportunities were also offered through the Palisades Stewardship Education Centre in Jasper National Park to GYPSD students and students from across the province.

## **Dual Credit Program**

Six students completed the Pre-Employment Welding Program and received applicable credits through Parkland Composite High School and Grande Prairie Regional College. All students were eligible to challenge the first period Alberta Apprenticeship welding exam.

## Work Experience Program

In the 2018/2019 school year, approximately 200 students from five GYPSD high schools and The Learning Connection participated in the program.

### Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP)

Twenty-six students from Parkland Composite High School, Harry Collinge High School, Grande Cache Community High School, and The Learning Connection were registered in the RAP program for the 2018/2019 school year.

### **First Nation Métis and Inuit Graduation**

First Nation Métis and Inuit graduation results improved for the 2018/19 school year as well as compared from the previous three-year average. The Drop-Out Rate measure lowered by two per cent which is an improvement on the previous three-year average, and is lower than the province by two per cent. The High School Completion rates for First Nation Métis and Inuit students also show a significant improvement of ten per cent which are greater than the province by ten per cent, and reflect a five per cent improvement on the previous three-year average.

## **Maintenance Summer Projects Report**

 K. Baluch, Managing Director of Facilities and Transportation, and Senior Team Advisor, provided an update to the Board on the facility projects completed over the summer including LED fixtures within school gymnasiums to improve lighting and energy efficiency.
