Etienna Moostoos-Lafferty - Roots & Raine Education. Collaboration. Innovation.

Mary Two-Axe Earley - I Am Indian Again

- "Mary Two-Axe Earley was a Kanien'kehá:kaiakón:kwe (Mohawk woman) who fought for more than two decades to challenge sex discrimination against First Nations women embedded in Canada's Indian Act, and became a key figure in Canada's women's rights movement. Despite attitudes and policies designed to oppress, Mary helped lead First Nations women from all over Canada in a movement to demand sex equality for First Nations women and their children that continues today's movement to demand sex equality for First Nations".
