Chair Karpluk extended the Board's best wishes to all the Grade 12 students writing their final exams in conclusion of their learning journeys with GYPSD, saying, "We are so very proud of [you]...we wish [you] all the best in [your] next steps - whether it's off to post-secondary, industry training, or full-time employment...May your journeys always bring you home safely."

The Board received a report from Deputy Superintendent Kastrinos and HR Manager Meghan Auriat on the resurgence in the use of the Division's Professional Development Funds for <u>ATA</u> and <u>CUPE staff</u>, following COVID, and a review of each school's instructional times and operational hours.
