
Board Meeting Brief

November 23, 2022





Chair Karpluk shared the Board's appreciation for the various ways GYPSD schools recognized Remembrance Day. The Board also recognized that Bully Awareness Week takes place each November to support students in learning how to recognize bullying and stop it.



Jasper Junior/Senior High School Principal Mark Crozier and Music Teacher Christina Gerhardt described the music courses available to students in the junior and senior high programs before sharing a video compilation of student performances.



Assistant Superintendent of Learning Services, Carra Aschenmeier, described the many Literacy and Numeracy initiatives and supports for students in GYPSD. Ms. Aschenmeier shared her appreciation for the work done by ESC educators to address early learning delays captured by the Division's comprehensive screening process. The Learning Services team shared the department's focus on teaching and assessing the new k-3 and k-6 <u>curriculum</u> and building a resource inventory for GYPSD teachers, and their work to <u>review the draft curriculum currently being piloted</u> in classrooms.



At the recent Alberta School Boards Association (ASBA) Fall General Meeting, GYPSD received two awards: Grande Cache teacher Amy Allers was recognized as a provincial winner for Zone 2/3 of the Edwin Parr Beginning Teacher Award, and the Board of Trustees was recognized for their commitment to and priority of Community Engagement. The ASBA Community Engagement Award for 2021/22 came as a result of the Board's approach to exploring the possible reconfiguration of grades between the two elementary schools in Hinton last spring.
