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- Encourage school staff and students to demonstrate knowledge and respect for diverse cultures.
- Build awareness/understanding of traditional territories and how they can be learned about and acknowledged appropriately.

- **Sihtoskàtowin** understanding that individuals cannot "do it alone" and we need to support and help each other
- **Manâcihtâwin** the principle of respectful relationships between all beings, animate and inanimate
- Tapwewin the obligation to speak the truth and be honest
