


GYPSD's Education Plan - Priority #1 Student Learning

As required by Alberta Education for all public school jurisdictions, the <u>Education Plan</u> identifies the goals and the strategies for improving student learning and increasing high school completion rates across the school authority. The plan is constructed each spring based on ongoing feedback and assessment data collected at the classroom, school, and Division level. Education Plans typically provide three to four-year commitments to research-informed strategies that promise high-effect outcomes if systematically and comprehensively applied across all classrooms. The systematic and comprehensive strategies are integrated with each school's continuous improvement plan - constructed with staff and stakeholders each fall.


