

As part of the Division's Department Update, Technology Director Lyle Lee noted the readiness for the PowerTeacher Pro <u>Digital Report Card</u> all elementary schools will be implementing for the upcoming first reporting period. The new digital reporting platform will ensure parents and guardians can access their child's learning, marks, attendance, and late data at any time. Parents and guardians can also see how their child is progressing through the specific learning outcomes in each subject area. Rather than waiting for official reporting dates, parents can log in, check their child's progress, and reach out to the teacher for conversations on intervention and support. The Assistant Superintendent of Division Services and Supports, Carra Aschenmeier, described the

Division's use of provincial and local assessment tools to determine where students may require extra support and resources. The Board shared their appreciation for the literacy, numeracy, and competency progressions Alberta Education provides to parents, and encouraged families to download and make use of the <u>resources the ministry provides parents as partners in education</u>.
