- <u>School-wide events</u> to spread understanding and build community.




Learning Blooms in Unique & Beautiful Outdoor Spaces

We'll Get You Moving!

- Transport over 2,300 students to and from school on 53 routes covering more than 7,800 kms daily!
- Provide busing services to neighbouring division partners in Edson, Hinton, the Lobstick zone, and Grande Cache.
- Ridership is up over 15 per cent from last year due to advanced implementation of 2024/25 distance eligibility.
- Increase in school charter service for students' extra-curricular activities resulted in a whopping 275 percent increase last year
- In-house Driving School trained 13 drivers last year and already 14 in September and October this year
 New First Rider program initiated to assist early riders to get safely on and off the bus

Board Advocacy Success

- New division-wide <u>Health and</u> <u>Wellness Committee</u> in 2023
- In the 2022/2023 school year, the Board approved a fourth priority for the Division - System Health and Wellness
- <u>Pyramid of Supports</u> for students including coaches from the Bringing Empowered Students Together (BEST) mental health program, Family School Liaison Counselors (FSLC) in every school, support from a Division Psychologist, and new this year, Wellness Navigators located in our high schools.
- Updates to Board Policy 20 Health and Wellness.
- Division partnership with <u>EdCan</u> through the <u>Well at Work</u> Initiative

- More mental health supports (received a \$1.2 million grant for Wellness Navigators in each high school beginning September 2023)
- As of Spring 2023, bus drivers no longer require MELT training which aligns with other provinces' legislative requirements)
- Advocating for the reinstatement of the fuel contingency cap and for increases to Transportation funding.

Students Shaping the Future

- New Division-wide <u>digital report card</u> accessible through the PowerSchool Parent Portal for all K-6 schools.
- Parents can now view in real-time on how well their child is achieving their learning outcomes throughout the school year versus the historical 'report card' sent home each term.

- GYPSD's <u>Superintendent Youth</u>
 <u>Council</u> invites students from the five high schools to discuss core issues of high importance to students. One project from this group led to vape detectors installed in the majority of schools.
- Last spring HCHS students were invited to attend the Generative/Navigate <u>Environmental</u> <u>Youth Leadership Summit</u> as only one of 20 schools in both BC & AB.
