Mrs. Miller was born and raised in Hinton, where she proudly graduated from Harry Collinge High School in 2008. After obtaining her Bachelor of Secondary Education in 2013, she has taught in K-12 settings in the communities of Wainwright, Niton Junction, and Hinton. In 2021, she completed her Leadership Quality Standard Certification, became trained as a Professional Learning Facilitator for the Rupertsland Centre for Teaching and Learning (2021), and obtained a Master of Elementary Education in 2024. Her graduate degree focused heavily on Indigenous Ways of Knowing, Epistemology, and Pedagogy. Her final Capstone project was titled *Achimowin: Commitments from Educators to Enact Change Through Lifelong Learning*. She has worked to develop a professional learning framework for educators, supported by an Indigenous ethical and epistemological model.

Coming from the Cardinal, Fellers, and Gardipy families, Mrs. Miller approaches teaching through a Metis lens, placing great focus on relationship building with students, staff, and parents. Working with her students has brought her an immense amount of happiness and purpose; and while she is hesitant to leave her classroom duties, she is eager to support Grande Yellowhead as a place for reconciliation-focused collaboration, reflection, and growth to ensure that all students can learn and succeed.

When not at school, Mrs. Miller can be found with her daughters, husband, dogs, and very large extended family. She enjoys sitting in sunbeams, paddle boarding, and designing bulletin boards. She is very, very thankful to her community of students, staff, and families that have loved and supported her along the way.
