

#### Honouring Orange Shirt Day and National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

On **September 30**, Canadians observe **Orange Shirt Day** and the **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation**. This is a vital opportunity for us all to reflect, learn, and commit to reconciliation. Our schools are committed to teaching about this history, helping students understand Indigenous cultures and the path to reconciliation.

Orange Shirt Day originated from Phyllis Webstad's story; her new orange shirt was taken on her first day at a residential school. This simple shirt became a powerful symbol of the cultural loss and trauma Indigenous children faced, reminding us that "Every Child Matters."

#### The National Day for Truth and

**Reconciliation**, a federal holiday, honours the children who never returned home from residential schools and the Survivors, families, and communities still impacted. **All GYPSD schools are closed** so that students, staff and our families can participate in the various events hosted in your community.

#### K-9 Assessment and Reporting in GYPSD Schools

All GYPSD schools from kindergarten to Grade 9 use **outcome-based reporting** to show student progress. Instead of just a single percentage, it focuses on what your child knows, understands, and can do for each specific learning goal of the Alberta curriculum.

This method provides **clearer feedback**, showing exactly where your child is strong and what they need to work on. It emphasizes their **growth** over time, rather than just comparing them to others.

Outcome-based reporting is delivered through digital report cards viewed online in the PowerSchool Parent Portal. In addition to receiving report cards, families can access their child's progress or challenges in real time.

### Wrapping up the First Semester

For all Grade 12 students, **Diploma Exams** are a key part of your final year, especially if you're planning for post-secondary education. These exams, set by Alberta Education, have a significant impact on your final course marks (currently **30% of your final grade** for each diploma course) and help ensure a province-wide standard of achievement.

#### Why are they important?

- They certify your achievement level in core Grade 12 subjects.
- Results are used by universities and colleges across Canada for admissions.
- They ensure consistency in academic standards across all Alberta schools.

#### **Preparing for them is crucial:**

- Start early! Don't wait until the last minute.
- Review your course material: Go through notes, textbooks, and assignments.
- Practice with old exams: Alberta
   Education provides past diploma exams
   online. This helps you understand the format and types of questions.
- Seek support: We are here to help! Talk to your teachers, use school resources, or consider study groups or prep courses.

Our schools are embracing advanced technology to create dynamic learning experiences. Beyond basic computers, classrooms are increasingly integrating truly innovative resources.

Our division has an extensive **Digital Lending Library** for students to use technology in creative ways to enhance their learning with the objectives set in Alberta's Program of Studies. Students are engaging with **robotics and coding kits**, learning computational thinking and problemsolving through hands-on creation. **Virtual and Augmented Reality (VR/AR)** is emerging, offering immersive field trips to distant lands or explorations of the human body that were once impossible. Teachers use **online platforms** (like Google Classroom) to post assignments, share resources (videos, articles), facilitate discussions, and provide feedback.

**Digital Citizenship and safety** is also a top priority at GYPSD. Schools teach vital online safety, responsible social media use, cyberbullying awareness, and understanding one's digital footprint. In today's digital world, protecting our school division's data and systems from online threats is more critical than ever. Our staff have mandatory **Cybersecurity Awareness** training to ensure we maintain a secure and safe learning and working environment



## **Empowering Mental Health Awareness: BEST and Wellness Navigators**

May is **Mental Health Awareness Month**, but GYPSD prioritizes student mental health and well-being all year long. This support comes through programs like **BEST** (**Bringing Empowered Students Together**) and services from the Division's **Inclusion Team**, which includes:

- Wellness navigators
- Behaviour support specialist
- Occupational therapist
- Speech-language pathologist
- Family school liaison counselors
- Division psychologist
- Behaviour therapy aides

This dedicated team works together to provide a comprehensive support system for students.

Focusing on mental health promotion and prevention, staff work within schools and the community to:

- Build resilience
- Increase mental health knowledge
- Help students develop coping skills

Their proactive approach equips students to manage stress, anxiety, and other challenges. The team also hosts community and parent awareness evenings on topics such as adult transitioning and autism resources.

## The Power of Reading for Developing Solid Literacy Skills

Reading is fundamental to developing strong literacy skills, which are essential for success in school and life. When children read, especially from a young age, they gain crucial abilities that go far beyond just recognizing words.

Reading significantly **expands vocabulary** by exposing children to new words and how they're used. It builds **phonological awareness** – understanding the sounds in language – which is vital for decoding words and improving spelling. Regular reading also enhances **comprehension**, allowing students to understand, interpret, and analyze what they read.

Beyond direct reading skills, it boosts **critical thinking**, imagination, and the ability to focus. Starting to read at an early age has huge benefits for children's learning. Kids who read just **20 minutes a day** are exposed to about **2 million more words annually** than those who read less. This drastically improves their **vocabulary** and overall **language skills**.

Studies show that children regularly read to by age three have stronger vocabularies. Critically, **90% of children with reading difficulties will achieve grade level** if they get help in Grade 1, but this drops significantly if help is delayed as per a widely cited consensus among reading experts and researchers such as Torgesen, Mathes, and the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD).

### **Get Ready for Back to School!**

With July winding down and August on the horizon, it's time for parents to start thinking about **back-to-school preparations for September!** A little planning now can make the transition much smoother for everyone.

Here's a quick reminder of key things to tackle:

- Routines are Key: Start gradually adjusting sleep schedules and morning routines to school-day timings.
- school Supplies & Clothes: Check school supply lists, take inventory of what you already have, and buy remaining items early to avoid the last-minute rush. Go through clothes and shoes to see what still fits.
- Health Checks: Book any necessary doctor, dentist, or eye appointments, and ensure immunizations are up-to-date.
- School Info: Look for communications from your school regarding class lists, welcome back events, and important dates.

Getting organized early helps reduce stress and ensures a positive start to the new school year for your child.
