

VIRTUAL LEARNING

Background

The Division recognizes that parents may exercise the decision to educate their child(ren) through Virtual Learning. Parents must register their child at a GYPSD school in order for the principal to arrange for the child to access virtual learning. Students will be supervised and supported by Division teachers.

Procedures

- 1. Students eligible to register in virtual learning include:
 - 1.1.1 Children who become six (6) years of age after September 1 of the school Year in which they are to be enrolled and who are recommended for enrollment by school personnel, in consultation with the parents;
 - 1.1.2 Children who become six (6) years of age or more by September 1 of the school year in which they are to be enrolled; and
 - 1.1.3 Students who are less than nineteen (19) years of age on September 1 of the school year in which they are to be enrolled.
- 2. Virtual Learning resources and material will be approved by GYPSD staff.
 - 2.1 A student enrolled in virtual learning will be provided education appropriate for the age and abilities of the student, including the following:
 - 2.1.1 The skills and competencies taught in each subject area and the other learning objectives to be achieved;
 - 2.1.2 The resource materials used to achieve the learning objectives; and
 - 2.1.3 The methods of assessment and the intervals between assessments.
 - 2.2 Principals reserve the right to decide if a student is suited for virtual learning.
 - 2.3 Students will enroll at their local school of choice, if they are not enrolled already;
 - 2.4 Students desiring to access virtual education will be assigned to a timetable within an existing cohort (if in elementary or junior high school), or timetabled accordingly in existing high school, core classes;
 - 2.5 All assigned teachers will arrange for regular Google Meets, post virtual presentations, materials, and offer a platform for virtual students to communicate with the teacher and each other; and
 - 2.6 It is the Principal's responsibility, as the school administrator, to assign teachers or create an instructional cohort in order to leverage staff FTE within their scope.

- 3. Division staff will carry out ongoing assessment of students enrolled in the virtual education program.
- 4. It is essential that students participating in the virtual education program have access to a computer with internet access and a working camera/microphone. At the discretion of the local principal, parents of students who are receiving virtual education through the Grande Yellowhead Public School Division, may book a desk at a local Learning Connection school for face-to-face support.
 - 4.1 Students, registered in the virtual education program through Grande Yellowhead Public School Division, may request admission to school-sponsored, extra-curricular activities at the discretion of the Principal. If costs are involved, parents will be informed of the costs prior to approval.
